

Flannery O'Connor: A Limit with Infinite Measure

The life and work of Flannery O'Connor, the great 20th-century American author, is showcased in this exhibit. As an important American novelist, essayist, and short-story writer, O'Connor's memorable characters and unforgettable settings reveal deep insights into our human existence. O'Connor once wrote: "Grace changes us and change is painful." She died at the age of 39 from complications of lupus after a 14-year battle with the disease, but not before leaving her mark on American literature.

Behind the Crisis, Beyond the Crisis: A New Concept of Work and of Finance

The financial and economic crisis calls us to change. Like all crises, it may be an opportunity to grow. But this opportunity can be missed if we do not try to assess the causes (not merely thescapegoats) behind the crisis and the factors which can move us beyond it. How and why did this crisis happen?
